PWPA holds 69th Annual General Assembly of Members

PWPA at its first digital event

The Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA) led by its Chairman, Mr. C. H. Liu, held its first Webinar in celebration of its 69th Annual General Assembly. The webinar is the first part of the Annual General Assembly which was held last October 8, 2020.

The webinar was attended by different stakeholders from the wood industry, the government, non-government organizations, academe, civil society and the private sector as well.

With the theme “The Wood Industry: Coping with the Challenges of the COVID-19 Pandemic”, the PWPA aims to provide the members of the Association with information about the government’s thrusts which will support moving forward of the industry which will contribute to the country’s economic recovery amidst the challenges brought by the COVID-19 Pandemic.

The PWPA invited representatives from the government to share with the members and other stakeholders how they respond to the

needs of the Wood Industry in this time of pandemic.

Department of Trade and Industry Bureau of Products Standards Director Neil Catajay who talked about how to empower the Forestry/Wood Industry businesses amidst COVID-19.

Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) Undersecretary Jonas Leones said the DENR has been innovating and adapting current policies to ensure that the country, especially the wood industry, remains steadfast amidst the crisis.

Department of Health Undersecretary Ma. Rosario Singh-Vergeire, on the other hand, made a presentation on the basics of COVID-19, on how the virus is spread and where the airborne transmission is possible. She stressed that to reduce transmission, one must strictly observe the health protocols.

DENR Undersecretary Jim Sampulna discussed the Forestry contribution to the wood industry and provided the direction of the DENR especially on the establishment of the Philippine Forest Certification System and the passage of the Sustainable Forest Management Act Bill.

Forester Emmanuel Umali, Secretary General of the Society of Filipino Foresters, Inc. and Department Manager of NAPOCOR, was the moderator of the webinar and facilitated the open forum.

Prior to the different presentations, PWPA Vice Chair Uy shared with the members and other stakeholders the results of the survey conducted by the PWPA among its

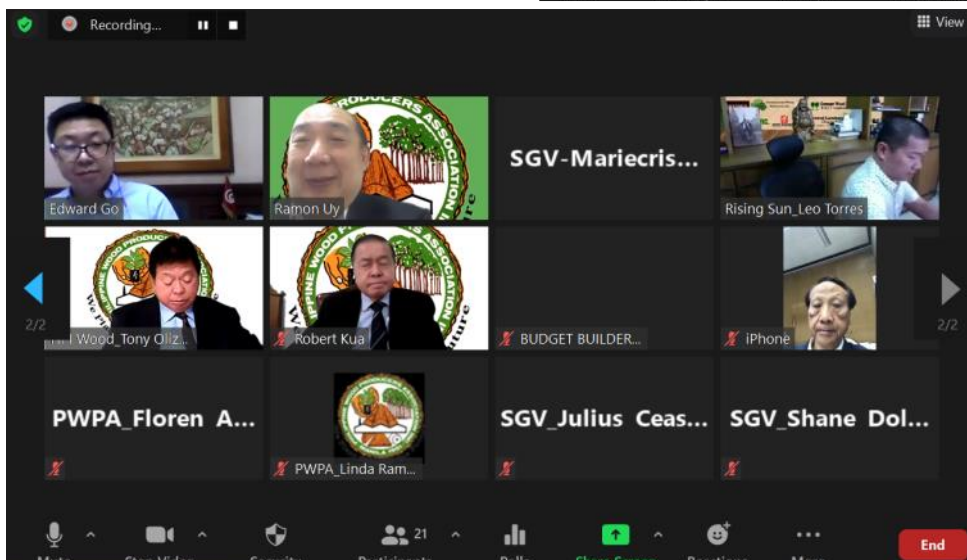
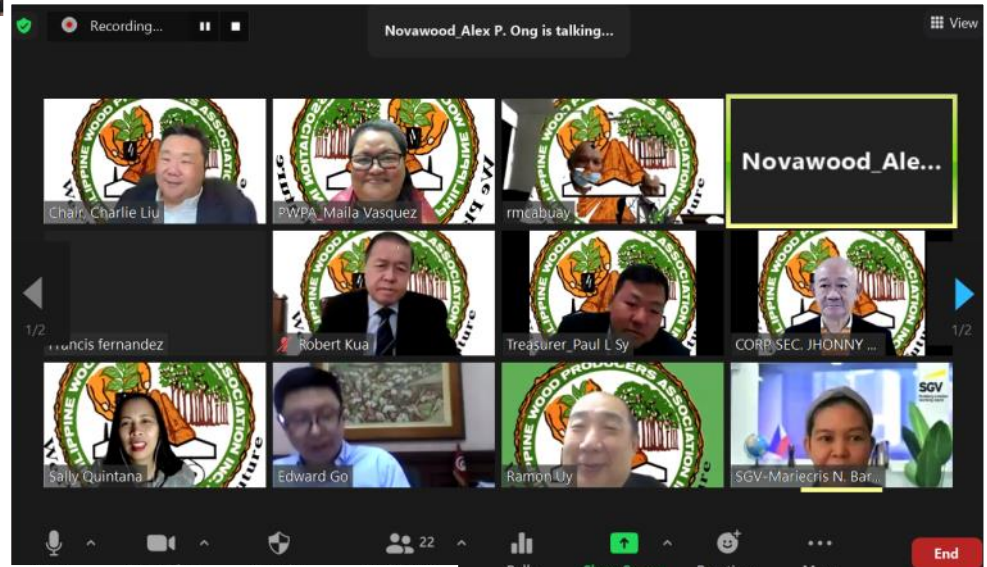


and encourage everyone to work together to make this happen.

PWPA CALLS FOR CONSULTATION MEETINGS ON THE NEW TECHNICAL REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE MANDATORY CERTIFICATION OF PLYWOOD

PWPA Members Consultation Meeting With The DTI BPS

The Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA) led by its Vice Chairman, Mr. R. Y. Uy, attended the consultation meeting with the Department of Trade and Industry Bureau of Product Standards (DTI BPS) on the draft Department Administrative Order on the New Technical Regulations Concerning the Mandatory Certification of Plywood last January 7, 2020 at the DTI Trade and Industry Building in Makati City. The PWPA requested the consultation meeting on behalf of its members to seek clarification and information about the guidelines so they will be aware and familiar about the guidelines when implemented.

DTI BPS Director Neil Catajay chaired the consultation and welcome the PWPA and its members. He said that it has been a while that the DTI BPS has been working with the

draft technical regulation (DTR). He added that he and his team appreciate working with the PWPA on matters relating to wood and wood products, among others.



DTI Undersecretary of the Consumer Protection Group, Atty. Ruth Castelo graced the consultative meeting and said that the DTI is very serious in ensuring that the consumers are well protected in the different construction materials that is being distributed in the local market. She added that she is thankful the Association supports the draft technical regulation and assured that everything is being undertaken to have smooth implementation of the Regulations.

PWPA Executive Director M. R. Vasquez, tasked as the spokesperson of the group, thanked the DTI BPS for giving the time for the clarification of issues from the DTR. She said that this is a great opportunity for the members present to hear directly from them answers from their clarifications. PWPA Vice Chair Uy also provided a short message saying that PWPA will be supporting the efforts of the Bureau as he knows that the draft regulations will be beneficial not only to the stakeholders but specifically to the consumers.

DTI BPS Director Catajay said they are glad to have this kind of meeting especially to Associations that will be directly affected by the draft regulations. They said that this is a way where they can reach out to many stakeholders as Associations have big membership and bring with them collective recommendations that are beneficial to all members. He added that one-on-one discussion is difficult as it usually is more on personal interests.

He added that they have received the PWPA's position paper and have acknowledged it. He said that they send a general acknowledgement letter saying the position paper is being reviewed but he assured that they have already answers on the issues raised on the position paper. He added that they have already compiled the comments submitted by stakeholders. He said that he can discuss them during the meeting.

He then provided answers to the issues in the paper and explained it to the members. The members also inquired about some points that were not clear to them.

The issue on the size of the sampling inventory is the item that was left unanswered as DTI BPS Director Catajay said that the size indicated in the draft regulations is just based on discussion with some of the technical staff in the forestry sector but he is asking the industry if they have idea what is the ideal or appropriate size for the sampling inventory as the PWPA said they will study what is appropriate and inform the DTI BPS.

There are also representatives from the RI Chemical Corp during the meeting and the answers to their position paper were also discussed.

DTI BPS Director Catajay thanked everyone who participated in the meeting and said that it is a fruitful one because they were able to

provide clarification about the draft regulations. He said that they will be providing the latest draft of the regulations to the PWPA for final comments before finalizing it. He said that this opportunity will only be given to PWPA because majority of the stakeholders affected by the regulations are members of the Association.

He added that the regulations aim not to make the process difficult for the stakeholders but to ensure that all stakeholders are legitimate, and the consumers' protection and safety are assured.

With it, PWPA Executive Director Vasquez thanked again DTI BPS Director Catajay for providing a detailed clarification and also said that PWPA is looking forward for the draft regulations that will be sent to them. She said that PWPA will look into the draft and submit the same immediately. She also thanked the members who took time and participated actively in the discussion.

PWPA Consultation Meeting With PWPA Members

The Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA), led by its Vice Chairman, Mr. R. Y. Uy, met with its members, plywood manufacturers and importers, to discuss the latest draft regulations it received from the DTI BPS. A separate meeting with the manufacturers on February 12, 2020 at PWPA Office and the importers on February 18, 2020 at McDonalds Greenbelt, Makati City were made.

The meetings were fruitful as they have shared suggestions on how the regulations will benefit both areas of the plywood sector. Items on the marking, sampling size and transition period were the most discussed topics, but the members have reached agreement on the said topics.

The position paper based on the meeting with members were prepared and submitted to the DTI BPS last February 21, 2020.

Vice Chair Uy and Mr. Edward Go were present during the meeting with the manufacturers while Trustee Randy Ng was with Vice Chair Uy during the meeting with the importers.

PWPA AT CONSULTATION WORKSHOP

PWPA Attends Consultation Workshop On CAVCS

Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA) Executive Director M. R. Vasquez attended the Consultation Workshop on Carbon Accounting Verification and Certification System (CAVCS) for Forest Projects in the Philippines last March 4-5, 2020 at Luxent Hotel, Quezon City.

The consultation workshop organized by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources, through the Forest Management Bureau (FMB, is piloting the CAVCS) with the assistance of the United States Agency for International Development (USAID). It aims to encourage investments in projects that maintain and sequester carbon by formally recognizing various forest protection, reforestation and other forest restoration activities. The workshop was conducted to present the system to the stakeholders from the different sectors of the society and to validate the content of the draft manuals on how to apply and the carbon accounting, monitoring and reporting.

FMB Director Lourdes Wagan made the welcome remarks and said that many has been inquiring about carbon trading and said that CAVCS will be one of the answers. She said that this will be a way where the carbon

emission could be offset with forest activities. She added that with the workshop she hopes that the system will be acceptable and could be implemented as soon as possible.

FMB CAVCS project staff presented the general principles of the project, the forest carbon project, the eligible projects, the carbon pools and greenhouse gas (GHG) emission sources included, who are eligible and how to apply, the benefits of registering forest project to CAVCS, project plan and assessment report, and the project monitoring and reporting.

During the presentation, although the eligible projects are forest protection, reforestation, among others in protection and production lands, the focus was always forest protection and conservation. Hence, it was suggested that the presentation should also provide examples in projects where there is utilization not only for the agroforestry project but for projects like IFMA where trees are harvested. It was added that by doing so, it will be clear to would be investors that not only do their project sequester carbon, but they also harvest the trees they planted.

Mining companies were very interested in the system but was informed that what they can only apply for CAVCS are their restoration efforts that is over and above what was indicated in their Environmental Compliance Certificate.

One of the workshop's purposes is to get the comments of the stakeholders on the manual but they have not provided the manual. When asked about the manual, the participants were informed that it will be emailed for further comments. They said they will include what has been discussed during the workshop before sending out the manual.

It was also discussed that since it is a certification system, a third-party verifier will be the one who will audit the project based

on the standards developed by the project team. The standards, they said, was prepared following the verified carbon standards.

PWPA AT ADVISORY AND NATIONAL COUNCIL MEETINGS

PWPA at the Earth Day Network Philippines Advisory Council Meeting

The Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA) is a member of the Advisory Council of the Earth Day Network Philippines (EDNP) and Trustee Antonio Olizon represents the PWPA.

During the Advisory Council meetings of the EDNP for the preparation of the Earth Day Celebration 2020 (ED 2020) on April 22, 2020, the Organizing Committee is chaired by EDNP President Wigberto Tanada, Jr. co-chaired by former DENR Secretary Elisea 'Bebet' Gozun. During the meetings, the PWPA was represented by Executive Director M. R. Vasquez. The meetings were scheduled on January 18, 2020 and every Saturday thereafter, except on February 8, 2020 (meeting was made on February 7, 2020), until the ED 2020 celebration. The main meeting venue was at the EDNP Headquarters, Blue Ridge, Quezon City except in Feb. 15, 2020, the meeting was held at Tuscany, Makati City hosted by Mr. Petteri Makitalo.

Year 2020 is the 50th Global Anniversary of the Earth Day Network International (EDNI) and it aims to make the celebration the most passionate and diverse global mobilization in defense of the environment throughout the world. This years' theme of the celebration is Global clean up and mobilization. For this theme, the Network planned different activities gearing to this theme.

The Network, which has been inactive for some time, is now reactivating its membership and requested the Advisory Council to assist in inviting again their members, friends, among others.

The main program of the ED 2020 will be held on April 22, 2020 and will consist of a short program followed by an exhibit. The venue will be in Manila's Kartilla ng Katipunan Shrine (formerly Liwasang Bonifacio). There will also be a clean-up activity and a short program on April 19, 2020 at SM MOA vicinity. There will also a week-long celebration of ED 2020 where different organizations will hold their own activities. EDNP also encourages all regions, provinces or municipalities to conduct their own parallel activities on April 22, 2020.

During one of the meetings, the sustainable forest management bill was discussed, and they were informed of its status. They were also informed that PWPA has been advocating for the establishment of more tree plantations but seems it is not a priority of the government.

Mr. Makitalo also shared his view that the Philippines can be a superpower in wood and wood products if this will be given attention.

The Council said that it could be one of the Network's activity after the ED 2020 Celebration.

The Council continuously meet every Saturday for the preparation of ED 2020 celebration and updating of activities related to the celebration.

PWPA Joins SFFI National Council Meeting In Cebu

Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA) Executive Director M. R. Vasquez joins the Society of Filipino Foresters, Inc.

Report to the Members

(SFFI) National Council Meeting last January 30, 2020 at DENR 7, Mandaue City, Cebu. PWPA Executive Director Vasquez is the present SFFI National Council (NC) Treasurer.

The meeting was presided by SFFI National Council President Tommy Valdez and tackled the different items on the agenda including the preparation of the National Conference 2020 where SFFI R7 is the host.

Regional Chapter President Peps Layese updated the members of the Council about the preparation being undertaken by the Chapter for the National Conference in Region VII. He said that all provincial chapters were given responsibilities for the preparation of the National Conference. He also mentioned that they have already identified the venue, the IEC Convention Center Cebu (IC3), Cebu City, which can house more than 3,000 people and is very suitable to the event. He said that the members can visit the site after the meeting.

The Council was also updated on the status of the EU FAO FLEGT Project on the Sustainable Forest Management Bill. SFFI NC President Valdez said that it has already been concluded and SFFI has submitted Phase 2 project which will focus on coordinating and lobbying with the Senate. He said that the Phase 1 project has been a good instrument in getting the support of the congress and other NGOs as well. It is hope that the Phase 2 will lead to the passing of the Bill to law.

Other programs of the SFFI were discussed such as the Carbon Neutral Project, among others. Financial status and other administrative items were also discussed.

Without any other queries from the members present, the meeting was adjourned and prepare for the visit to IC3, Cebu City.

PWPA Joins SFFI National Council Meeting Via Zoom

Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA), and Society of Filipino Foresters, Inc. (SFFI) National Council (NC) Treasurer, Executive Director M. R. Vasquez joins the SFFI National Council Meeting last May 20, 2020 via Zoom Meetings.

The meeting was presided by the SFFI National Council President Tommy Valdez. He said that it is good that even with the pandemic, there is still a way of communication and added that he thinks it is better because many can attend the meeting.

He said that the primary purpose of the meeting is to decide whether to push through with the Conference this year considering that the presence of the threat of COVID. After a thorough deliberation, it was decided to postpone it to next year, but webinars will be undertaken so that foresters will have their CPD points for the renewal of their professional license.

On the Sustainable Forest Management Bill, President Valdez said that Phase 2 of the project is still being reviewed by FAO but hoping that it will be approved soon. However, he said that even without the project, continuous coordination with the congress and senate is being done. He said that they are seeking help with other Senators like Honorable Miguel Zubiri, Pia Cayetano, among others. He encouraged all Regional Chapters who have Senators in their Region to get their support.

Other programs of the Society were also discussed such as the Carbon Neutral Project. They also discuss how the Arbor Day and the environment day will be celebrated and agreed that this will be done in partnership with the DENR as majority of the chapters are from DENR.

PWPA ATTENDS TECHNICAL COMMITTEE MEETINGS ON FOREST AND FOREST PRODUCTS (TC 78)

Regular Technical Committee Meeting on Forest and Forest Products (TC 78)

Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA) Executive Director M. R. Vasquez attended the regular Technical Committee Meeting on Forest and Forest Products (TC 78) last February 20, 2020 and March 3, 2020 at the DTI, Makati City and DENR-FMB, Quezon City, respectively. PWPA Executive Director Vasquez is also the Chair of the TC 78 which is mandated to develop the Philippine National standards on Certification of Forest and Forest Products.

The TC 78 has been meeting consistently to complete the standards for the Sustainable Forest Management of Plantation Forests for the past months and on March 3, 2020, the indicators which will be used in the audit or certification of the plantation forests in the country has been completed. However, the framework on how it will be done needs to be completed also.

There is a company who needs to have their sources certified hence it has supported the TC in the cross-visit dialogue and consultation of the draft standards.

During the meeting, the schedule of the dialogue with selected regions was already finalized with the first dialogue scheduled on April 15, 2020.

With the short time to complete the framework, it was agreed to have the comments be emailed not later than March 13, 2020 to give time for consolidation of the comments.

PWPA joins Skype Meeting of Key Members of TC 78 with PEFC

Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA), and TC 78 Chairman, Executive Director M. R. Vasquez joins meeting with the Programme for Endorsement of Forest Certification (PEFC) last May 27, 2020 through Skype to get their suggestion in completing the PNS on the framework of Sustainable Forest Management on Plantation Forests it is similar with the PEFC standards.

During the meeting, the PEFC was represented by Mr. Richard Laity and Ms. Wikki Netten.

Mr. Laity said that the Philippines can use the PEFC standards but should have their own indicators on how the forest areas in the country shall be audited and that the process of developing standards should be the same with the PEFC process. He was informed by the DTI BPS that the TC has already completed the indicators for the standard and that the process used is similar to the PEFC's.

Mr. Laity was asked if a company in the Philippines can already apply for PEFC for certification for their sources and he said that unless there is already the system, that will be the time that company in the Philippines can directly apply for PEFC certification. He emphasized that the requirement is the developed certification system. He suggested that while there is no certification system yet, the company can apply to PEFC for controlled sources.

With the information, the TC suggested to facilitate the establishment of the system. The National Governing Board will be requested to convene so this will be facilitated.

PWPA joins the TC 78 Small Group Workshop

Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA), and TC 78 Chairman, Executive Director M. R. Vasquez joins the TC 78 Small Group Workshop last September 8 & 10, 2020 at PWPA Executive Room, Makati City to facilitate the drafting of the Philippine National Standards for Sustainable Forest Management System (SFMS) Requirements: Plantation. The standards will be used for the certification of plantations, in public forest lands or in private lands.

The members of the small group are Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA), Philippine Center for Environmental Protection and Sustainable Development, Inc. (PCEPSDI), and Society of Filipino Foresters, Inc. (SFFI) with the assistance of its Technical Officer from the Department of Trade and Industry - Bureau of Philippine Standards (DTI-BPS).

The small group agreed that one standard will be developed for the SFMS and the requirements or criteria/indicators that will be used for the certification of plantation/s. The standards will use the ISO 9000 (Quality Management System), PNS 14001 and 14004 (Environmental Management System and General Guidelines), PEFC SFM Requirements, and the DENR QMS Manual.

The small group has already completed the standards for the requirements or criteria/indicators. The criteria and indicators were based on the existing criteria and indicators developed by the Forest Management Bureau with the International Tropical Timber Organization (ITTO).

Another workshop is scheduled on September 18, 2020 to discuss the remaining parts of the manual. For ease of discussion, each representative was given assignment to be submitted on the 17th of September so

that there will already be a working document for discussion.

PCEPSDI will draft the introduction and the context of the organization and national standard, PWPA the General – SFMS and its processes, and SFFI the performance evaluation and improvement.

The normative references and terms, definitions and abbreviated items will be tackled last to ensure that all references and terms will be covered.

PWPA JOINS WEBINAR/S

PWPA at the Covid 19 Forestry Webinar Week

Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA) Executive Director M. R. Vasquez joins the Covid 19 Forestry Webinar Week last June 22-25, 2021 at 12:00-15:00 CET (6:00 – 9:00 PM Manila Time) via Zoom Platform. It is a weeklong activity undertaken during the schedule of the Committee on Forestry (COFO) and World Forestry Week. This features series of virtual sessions which comprise high-level events and technical thematic sessions that are organized by FAO's Forestry Department in Rome with partnership with agencies/departments within and outside FAO.

The objectives of the webinar week are: a) assess impacts of pandemics on people and forests; b) identify and discuss possible responses that help mitigate impacts on people and forests and help address the situation in the short term while at the same time contributing to building a more resilient and sustainable future; and c) propose follow-up steps, including policy dialogue and mobilizing of resources and action that better enables the forest sector to help rebuild sustainable and resilient societies (building back better).

Report to the Members

During the high-level discussion, heads of different international Forestry agencies discussed the COVID-19 impacts for the forest sector, the main issues, response needs and opportunities of building back better. There was also a discussion on how to integrate forestry in recovery support measures based on the responses made during the Head of Forestry dialogue.

For the thematic sessions, the following were discussed: 1) Mitigating impacts on forest-dependent people and recovery support to enhance their resilience; 2) Mitigating impacts on forests and restoration to enhance ecosystem and community resilience; and 3) Building back better legal and sustainable value chains.

The webinar also gave a glimpse on the World Forestry Congress preparation which will be held in South Korea next year, 2021.

It also provided the results of the global survey of the Sustainable Wood for a Sustainable World (SW4SW) as follows:

- a. Forestry work has gone remote with COVID-19. This has been the most adopted strategies/measures by the private sector and has indicated to continue to adopt digital technologies moving forward.
- b. The COVID-19 might have improved health standards along the wood value chains. The third highest ranked strategies/measures adopted by the private sector to face the immediate impacts of the pandemic is the monitoring and compliance with health and safety guidelines from competent national authorities.
- c. Wood products businesses are strongly considering quality and social standards, as well as efficiency in the recovery phase. The adoption of industrial

certification, inclusion of workers in social protection and decent employment schemes, health care facilities, increased resource efficiency, and labor-saving innovation as the most relevant measures indicated by the respondents.

- d. The main measure considered for the recovery phase by the logging and solid wood sub-sectors is the adoption of industrial certification. The providers of silvicultural activities are more focused on financial support to out-growers and other main suppliers.
- e. Exploring the role of forestry in poverty alleviation and generation of employment is a clear message from the SW4SW stakeholders to build back better. The integration of smallholders, communities, and SMEs in sustainable supply chains, including horizontal and vertical integration is considered the most effective approach. The generation of employment through investments in restoration comes close to the second most effective.

PWPA at PCIMS and ICC Mobile App Walkthrough and Demo Webinar

Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA) Executive Director M. R. Vasquez, together with other PWPA members, attended the PWPA at PCIMS and ICC Mobile App Walkthrough and Demo Webinar last September 3, 2020 via Zoom Platform.

The Department of Trade and Industry Bureau of Philippine Standards DTI BPS organized the webinar to demonstrate to their clients how to use the Product Certification Information Management Systems (PCIMS) and Import Commodity Clearance (ICC) Mobile App.

DTI Undersecretary Ruth Castelo opened the event and welcome all participants and said that they are trying their best to make all transactions online. PCIMS is a start but is not yet totally online because the payment part is not yet included in the program, but they are trying to include it in the process.

She said that they have developed the application to assist their clientele and consumers in ensuring that transactions are easier and faster, and the consumers are protected from substandard products and unscrupulous agents.

The following demonstrated how the PCIMS and the ICC mobile app can be accessed and used:

- a. Mr. Jose Paolo Ayson discussed how to access the PCIMS for Philippine Standard (PS) License (for local and foreign manufacturers)
- b. Mr. Anel John Christopher Ervite, the PCIMS on ICC (for importers)
- c. Mr. Rino Mores, gave a walkthrough on the ICC Verification Mobile App.

Mr. Frankincense Macula, Ms. Jaclyn Vanessa Macapagal and Czer Eljohn Cruz were the panelist during the open forum and answered the questions from the participants. DTI BPS Director Neil Catajay, before giving his closing remarks, volunteered to answer other questions. He said that for more questions, they can be reached through phone, email and their facebook page. He said that because most of the staff are working from home, they can immediately answer their queries through their FB page.

Webinar on Futureproofing Foresters' Mindset Towards Accelerated Forest Development

Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA) Executive Director M. R. Vasquez was invited by the UPLB CFNR Forestry Development Center (FDC) to be one of the discussants for the paper of Dr. Manuel Bonita on the above subject. Dr. Bonita requested two lady foresters to be his discussants with Forest Management Bureau (FMB)

Director Ludy Wagan, however she was not available hence, FMB Assistant Director (AD) Edna Nuestro took her place. The webinar was held last October 13, 2020 via Zoom Platform.

Dr. Bonita's paper focused on the need for foresters to think out of the box in order to attain the desired outcome like to have 85% forest cover in forest land, to lift the upland communities from poverty, a competitive forest industry, a country with self-sufficiency of wood and wood products supply and extra for export, and foresters having a balance of employment in private and public sectors.

He also provided models that can be done to make development of tree plantations encouraging not only to big investors but to small farmers as well.

He said to work on what is available and not wait for policies in doing these developments as it will take time, and nothing will be accomplished when you wait for these policies. He added that there is a need to move forward and not to dwell on the past but to work on how these could be improved.

FMB AD Nuestro's presentation in response to Dr. Bonita's paper focused on the programs identified in the Master Plan for

Climate Resilient Forestry Development and said that they have recommended the models presented by Dr. Bonita to be pilot tested in all provinces of the country.

PWPA ED Vasquez, on the other hand, said futureproofing is already a statement of the past as the country's forestry development has already been left behind by neighboring countries. She said that futureproofing should have been done many years ago and that what is needed now is to be more pro-active in decision making and to really see how the sector can contribute to revive the economy of the country.

With regards to the models presented, she said that it was not new and has been proven to work in some areas before hence she agreed that it can be used presently however, the government cannot force the investors to implement it if said investors have other models in mind to follow.

She also mentioned that to really help the country to revive its economy and to realize the outcomes Dr. Bonita presented in his paper, a stable policy, investment-friendly environment and consistent implementation of the policies are still necessary. She also added other recommendations of the PWPA in reviving the economy of the country.



In closing, UPLB CFNR FDC Director Priscila Dolom thanked the speakers and the discussants as well as the participants in joining the webinar and hope that the participants learned something in the paper presented. She said that they will continue to hold the Policy e-talks so they will be able to develop more policies based on the needs of the time.

PWPA at the Orientation on DTI DAO 20-06 or The New Technical Regulation Concerning the Mandatory Certification of Plywood

Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA) Executive Director M. R. Vasquez with other PWPA members attended the Orientation on newly approved DTI DAO 20-06 or The New Technical Regulation Concerning the Mandatory Certification of Plywood organized by the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Bureau of Product Standards (BPS) last October 23, 2020 via Zoom Platforms.

About 38 PWPA members were seen to having attended the Orientation as others have not properly indicated what their office they are representing.

The presentation on the DAO was in order however during the open forum, there are certain questions that were not answered well. There are also some questions that were not answered due to time limitation.

Due to this, the PWPA is requesting the DTI-BPS for a meeting to clarify some issues regarding the Import Commodity Clearance and the inclusion of overlaid plywood in the DAO. However, prior to the meeting, there will be a small group meeting with PWPA Vice Chair R. Y. Uy, Trustee R. C. Ng and Mr. E. C. Go to discuss the position of PWPA which will be presented to the DTI-BPS.

PWPA ATTENDS DENR MEETINGS

Meeting with DENR on EO 23

Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA) Executive Director M. R. Vasquez joins the face-to-face meeting with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) last September 7, 2020

at the DENR, Quezon City. The objective of the meeting is to discuss the Executive Order No. 23, Declaring a Moratorium on the Cutting and Harvesting of Timber in the Natural and Residual Forests and Creating the Anti-Illegal Logging Task Force.

The meeting was attended by representatives from DENR, PWPA, IFMAP, SFFI. The DENR was led by Undersecretary Sampulna with representatives from FMB, Policy and Planning, Enforcement Group, DENR R-4A, among others.

The PWPA, IFMAP and SFFI shared with the group their recommendations regarding the EO 23.

- a. As observed, IFMAP has a focused recommendation, for the IFMA holders who stopped due to EO 23 be allowed to operate again.
- b. The PWPA share their recommendations based on the position paper submitted, to review the performance of IFMA holders as provided in EO 23 and selectively allow those who are compliant and practiced SFM; identify and review suspended or cancelled IFMAs and award to interested investors; and to promote the establishment of more tree plantations to support the wood requirement of the country as most of the wood products in the market are imported. Establishment of the Forest Certification System was also suggested as this is also part of the EO 23 and the PWPA's position paper.
- c. SFFI recommended to implement EO 23 which mandated for the review of all IFMA in the natural and residual forest, allow operation of those with good performance but must submit re-entry plans, establishment of the Forest Certification System. He said that the forestry sector will have significant contribution to the economic recovery of the country. He also

added that there is a need to delineate the boundary for production forest.

The FMB, represented by Forester Quilloy, said that the implementation of IFMA did not really stopped. He said that from 45 IFMA when EO 23 was issued, there is already about 60 of them at present. He added that the review of the IFMA has been done and the findings showed that less than 10 have shown good performance. He said they cannot release the results unless signed by the Secretary.

He added that there is a guidelines that is being drafted for a one tenurial instrument in the forestry sector which is called Sustainable Forest Management Agreement that will allow a multiple use of the area whenever possible without compromising the purpose and benefit of one land-use.

He also informed that there is a policy amending the validity of wood processing plants from 3 years to 5 years to be consistent with EO 23 where supply contract's validity of 5 years.

With this, Usec Sampulna said that since the IFMA implementation did not stopped, he inquired if those IFMA that did not do anything means non-compliance and FMB affirmed it.

With the statement, the PWPA and IFMAP agreed in saying that it was not the case. The PWPA said that the DENR through a resolution ordered to bring down all equipment and all workers in the area. She said maybe in the case of IFMA with plantation, it is true but not for IFMA in natural and residual forests.

The IFMAP, on the other hand, appealed for that for those IFMA holders that showed non-compliance be given the chance to accomplish their backlogs so they can operate again as it will take time if these

areas will be re-awarded to another stakeholders.

With the foregoing, Usec Sampulna made the following instructions:

- a. The FMB to prepare the results of the evaluation; the PWPA and IFMAP to prepare an appeal to allow all IFMAs stopped by EO 23 who are compliant to operate again, for non-compliant IFMAs to have chance to accomplish their backlogs so they can operate again, re-entry plans to be submitted;
- b. The delineation of the production forests, he was informed that there is budget for this activity;
- c. SFFI to assist in the development of the re-entry plan template.

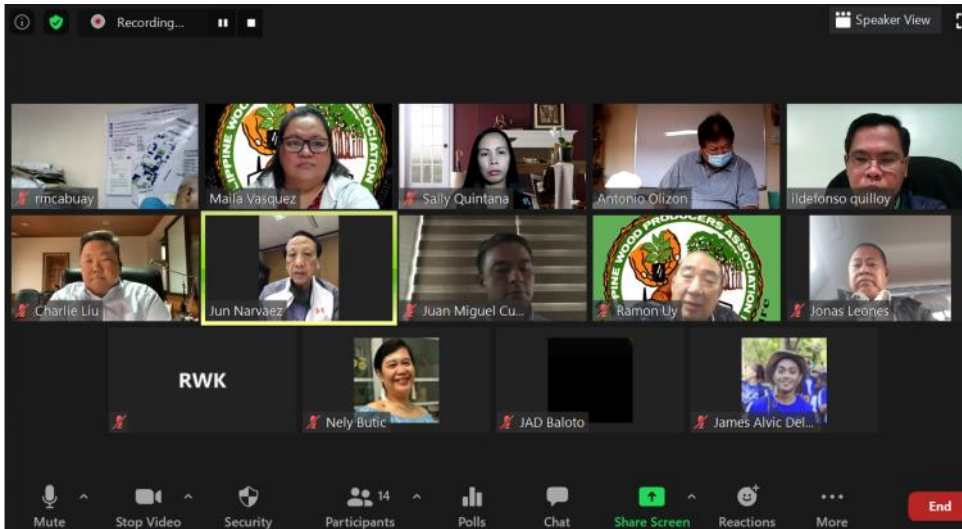
Meeting with DENR Undersecretaries Juan Miguel Cuna and Jonas Leones and the FMB Staff

The Philippine Wood Producers Association, Inc. (PWPA) led by Chairman C. H. Liu met with the DENR last October 2, 2020. The DENR was led by DENR Undersecretary Juan Miguel Cuna and with him are Undersecretary Jonas Leones, Forest Management Bureau (FMB) Director Lourdes Wagan and other FMB staffs. The meeting aims to discuss with the DENR their programs that will allow the forestry and wood industry to support the economic recovery of the country.

The meeting is very productive, and the following were the highlights of the meeting:

- The DENR is in a strategic position to address the poverty situation in the countryside by generating employment as the rural-based Forestry and Mining Sectors are in its realm

- The Forestry sector has a vast potential in contributing to the economic recovery of the Philippines in a sustainable manner as forestry resources are renewable
- The forestry sector includes operating businesses who employed thousands who were forced to suspend/terminate their operations and paid millions in separation pay for skilled and unskilled employees when EO 23 imposed a moratorium on harvesting in the natural forest. Thus, if the objective is to jumpstart the recovery process, the existing IFMA holders would be in a better position to restart their operation because of their knowledge and experience gained through generations.
- The Integrated Forest Management Agreement through selective logging in the natural forest and development of tree plantations can provide significant contribution in terms of job generation and long-term economic development.
- All IFMA were evaluated and the results of the recommendation are the cancellation of most of the IFMAs due to violation of the terms and conditions of the agreement and DAO 99-53, among others.

- The report is not yet final; the recommendations are still subject to the clarification of the proponents. Every IFMA has its own peculiarities hence have different conditions for its implementation

- Restarting IFMA operation whether to be handled by the existing holder or by new industry player is one of the suggestions being considered. For existing holders given the opportunity

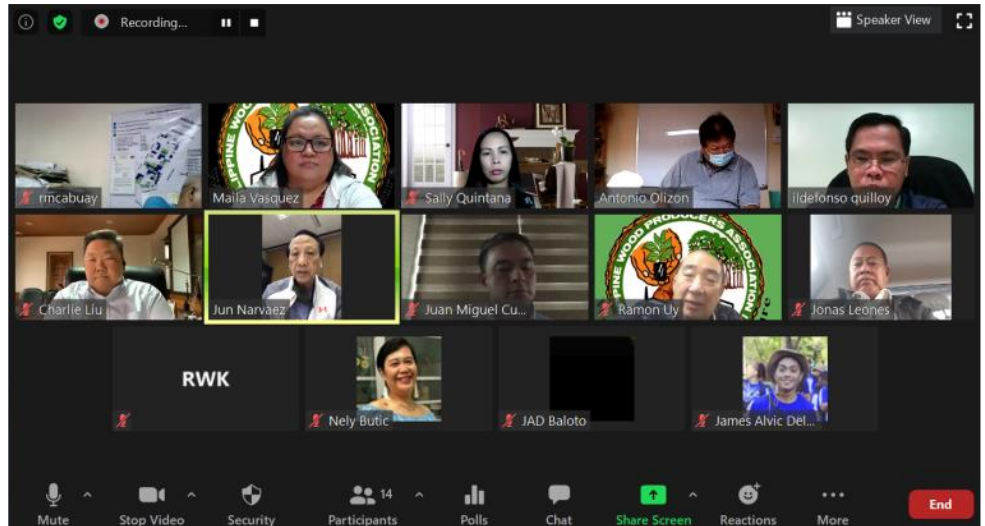
to reboot, what conditions do they need to do? For new players, what are the new conditions/protocols?

- The PWPA appeals for leniency and understanding of the difficult financial conditions of the existing IFMA holders in the evaluation. It is a practical reality that with the prolonged moratorium, IFMA holders with strained resources could not continue complying with their obligations especially when they have already paid separation pay for their employees and still have to continue paying their loans to banks and financial institutions and suppliers.
- The DENR has started offering IFMA purely for tree plantation and bamboo plantation.
- The PWPA advocates the promotion of establishing more plantations. This is an area where the country is extremely competitive as it can grow trees all year round because of the tropical climate.
- Many studies and research showed commercially developed wood as a sustainable alternative to cement and steel.

Report to the Members

- Most members of the PWPA are in its second/ third generation who are very passionate in the advocacy on wood but there is also the realistic intention of recouping their investment with consideration on the 3 bottom lines: economic, social and environmental aspects
- The PWPA would like to see that the country will be self-sufficient in its wood production like other countries
- One strategy is to open up the forestry sector on limited harvesting with safeguards like ensuring that all cut trees will be replaced and proper monitoring and management of harvesting activities. This is being discussed with the DENR Secretary.
- The forestry sector has a limited representation with the government compared to other sectors like mining. But with the assistance of FMB and the wood industry and other stakeholders in the sector, pushing for the revitalization of the sector will be realized.
- The Society of Filipino Foresters, Inc. led by Forester Tommy Valdez is also helping the sector
- The IFMA is a viable platform for tree plantation development and the rules should be made investment friendly supported by stable policies to easily market it to international and domestic investors, to invest in such a risky long-term investment

Both Undersecretaries said that all matters discussed during the meeting will be



considered and be included as additional information on their discussion on how to revitalize the forestry sector and the wood industry.

The PWPA agreed that with the DENR taking the lead in reviving the forestry sector, the PWPA will facilitate and help promote the program/s to the members of the industry however the final decision will still be the private sector/individual companies. But with a clear rule of engagement and security of tenure, many companies will be encouraged to put their investments in the sector.

The PWPA will continue to support the programs of the DENR and is optimistic that with the continuous collaboration, it will be realized.

Meeting with FMB on SFMA Bill

Vasquez joins the face-to-face meeting with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) Forest Management Bureau (FMB) to discuss the comments provided by FAO Consultants on the SFMA Bill approved by the House Committee on Appropriation last November

27, 2020 at the DENR-FMB Conference Rm., Quezon City.

There is a need to discuss the approved bill because the version that was submitted as approved by the House Committee on Natural Resources was replaced by a version that is not the one approved by the Technical Working Committee. This was studied and commented by FAO consultants Dr. Ernie Guiang and For. Wilbur Dee and the comments will be discussed with PWPA, SFFI and DENR-FMB.

Upon consultation with the House Committee on Natural Resources, the Bill can still be revised during the plenary if this will be sponsored by another member of the House.

As this form part of the project of the Society of Filipino Foresters, Inc. (SFFI), they took the lead in coordinating this to the House of Representatives.

Representatives from the DENR-FMB, SFFI and PWPA were present during the meeting. The Bill was reviewed line by line and discussion focused whether to accept or retain the provisions in the draft Bill. Some of the provisions, among others, were discussed:

- a. The bill promoted forest production zones. This will cover the areas in the residual forests that is under tenure and identified as production zone.
- b. Accepted the approval of the House Committee on Appropriations on FMB to become a line Bureau
- c. Delineation of the production and protection forests
- d. Deregulation of harvesting, transport and processing of planted forest products, in private and in public lands

After the discussion, SFFI President Tommy Valdez said that the draft Bill with the corresponding changes will be sent to all present so they can review if there were provisions that still need corrections. He said that he has already talked with some Congressman who can sponsor the Bill during the plenary session. He said further that that the SFFI is also coordinating with the Senate so a parallel bill can be passed.

The FMB representatives are hopeful that the Bill, as revised, will pass Congress. They said FMB being a line Bureau will give advantage to the sector.
